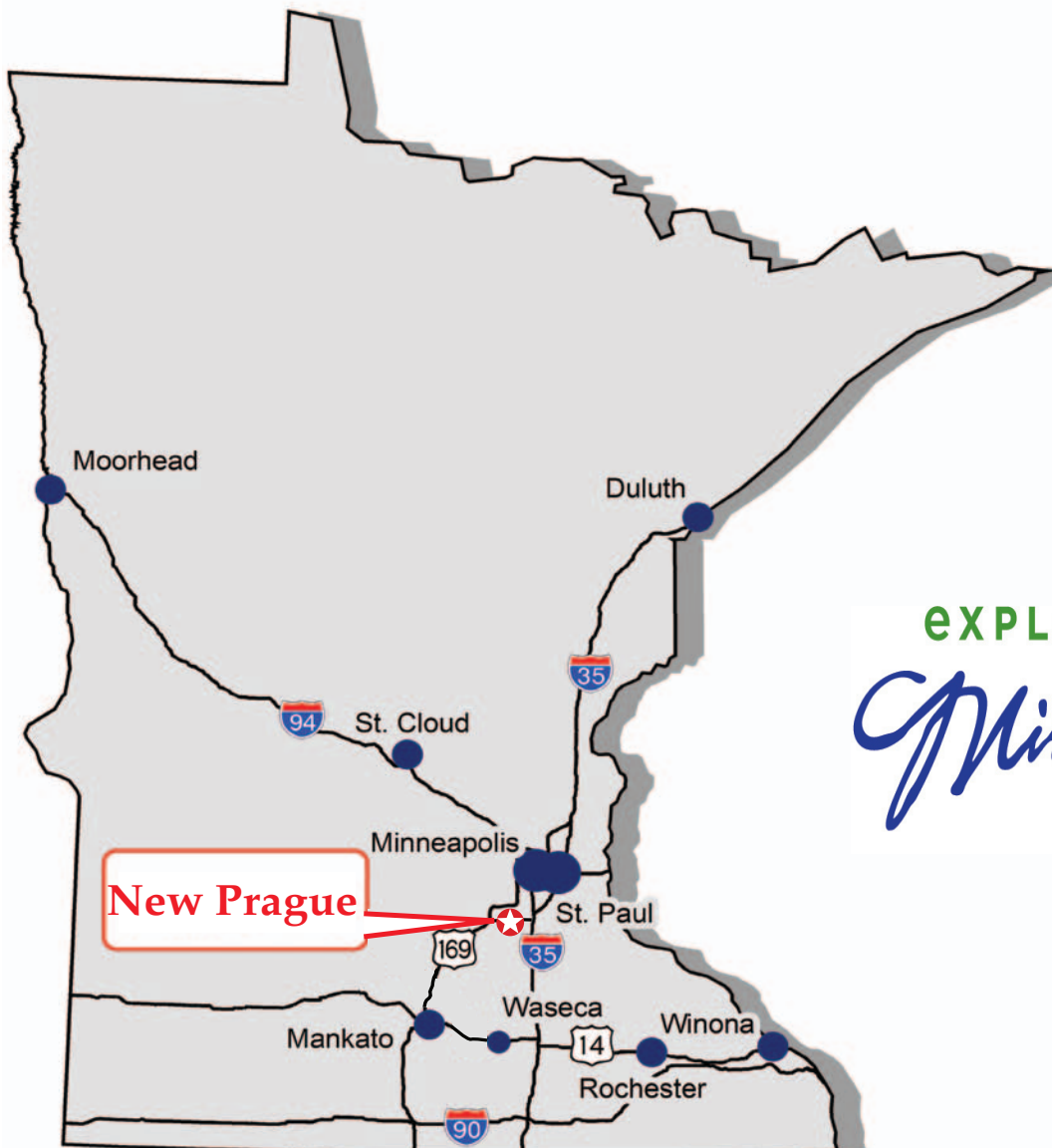


COMMUNITY PROFILE

New Prague is a dynamic community with a growing population of over 6,400 located in south central Minnesota. Conveniently located near a major regional hub and approximately 45 miles from the Twin Cities, New Prague offers a variety of parks and year-round recreational activities.

Come walk, jog, or bicycle on the city's Greenway Trail or any one of the other five parks with trail access. If golfing or swimming is your passion, Memorial Park offers an 18-hole municipal golf course as well as a municipal pool for your enjoyment. Your family can also spend a day picnicking or just relaxing at any of the park/nature areas.

Make plans to attend the annual town festival in September in Memorial Park. In the winter months, activities include sledding, ice skating, cross-country skiing and other recreational games. Join us in New Prague, a city that maintains its extensive park and trail system through a Park Board and City Council dedicated to future recreational planning.

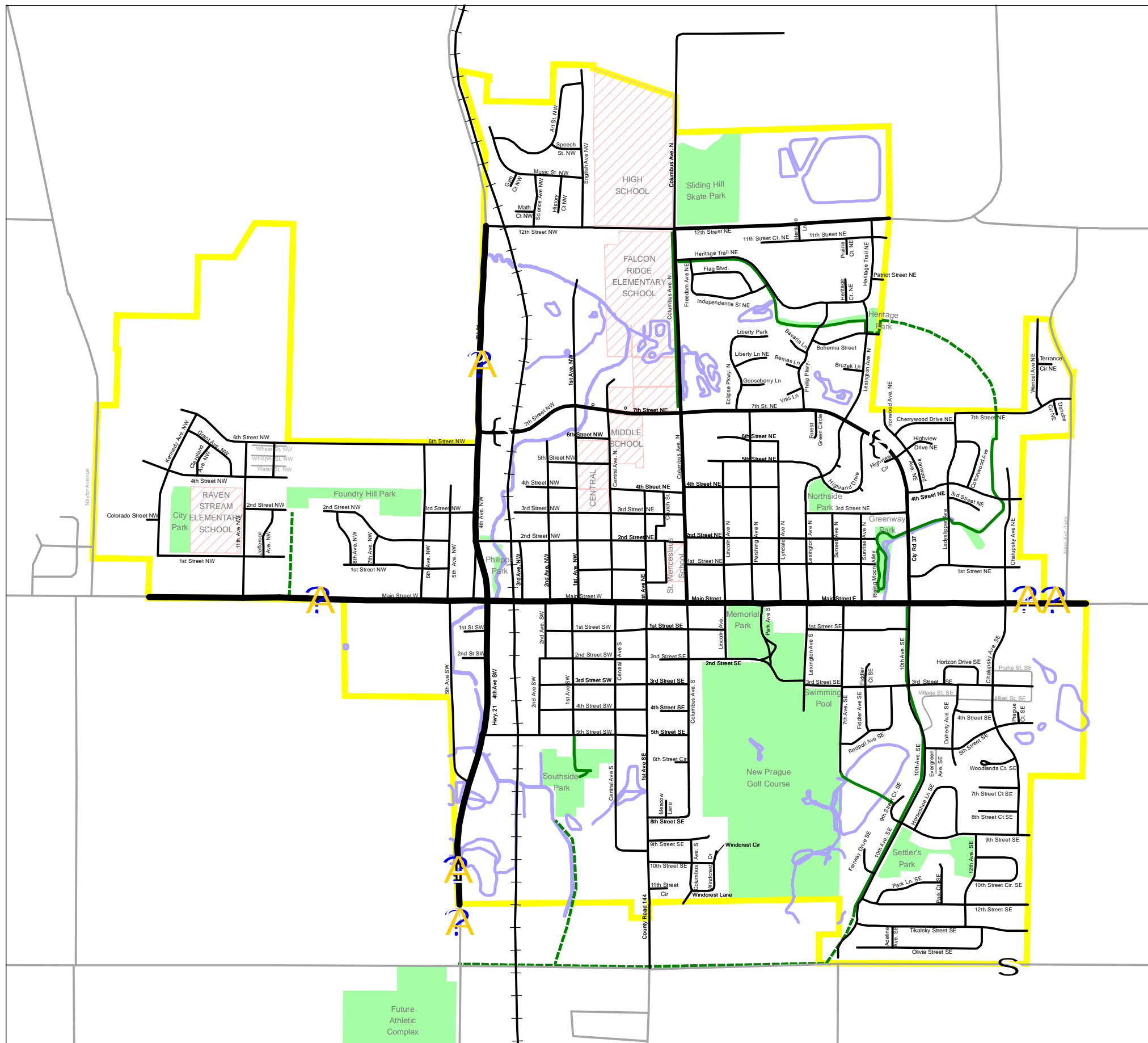
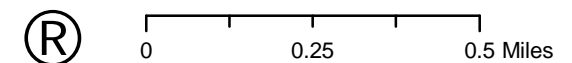


City of New Prague Park Location Map
