Paving on Lincoln Avenue N between Main Street and 4th Street NE will occur on Thursday, July 3rd. Please avoid parking or turning sharply on the new pavement if possible until it has cooled. As a reminder, the pavement will be left 1.5-inches low with the final surface to be placed next summer.

On Pershing Avenue N, all sanitary sewer and water main is complete with services expected to be completed either today or tomorrow. One of the pipe crews will be leaving on Monday with the remaining crew installing the remaining storm sewer on the project. All utility work is expected to be complete over the next two weeks.

Concrete crews are expected to return on Monday next week. They will be working on the north block of Lincoln Avenue N, west block of 1st Street NE, and south two blocks of Pershing Avenue NE. Sidewalk on 2nd Street NE will be excavated and prepared starting on Monday with placement expected later in the week.

Remember, anything within the public right-of-way could be in jeopardy of being damaged and/or removed. This includes landscaping, irrigation or pet containment systems, etc. Those systems are considered "private" facilities. Locating them and marking them in and near the right-of-way is the property owner's responsibility. It would be helpful for those of you who have irrigation or pet containment systems to contact John so that we are made aware of them. **There is a high likelihood that items within the right of way, including irrigation and landscaping will be damaged or otherwise affected by construction activities. Repairs to these items are the responsibility of the property owner.**
