Holtmeier Construction has installed temporary water on Lincoln Avenue N, south 2nd Street NE, and is currently salvaging topsoil and removing the old pavement from this area. This work will continue into early next week. Utility crews will be starting their work on Tuesday with the installation of water main starting from Main Street and working their way north. A second utility crew is expected later in the week to begin installation of sanitary sewer. Work on these utilities in this area of Lincoln Avenue is expected to occur much of the next two weeks.

CenterPoint Energy will continue its installation of new gas mains and services in the area. Please note that CenterPoint will be in contact with residents as gas service is replaced.

With construction occurring, access to properties from the street will be limited and we ask that you use alleys for access where available or park on side streets.

Survey stakes will be placed on the construction site. **Destruction or alteration of survey stakes results in slowing the work and additional cost to the City.**

This is the time to remind everyone that anything within the public right-of-way could be in jeopardy of being damaged and/or removed. This includes landscaping, irrigation or pet containment systems, etc. Those systems are considered "private" facilities. Locating them and marking them in and near the right-of-way is the property owner's responsibility. It would be helpful for those of you who have irrigation or pet containment systems to contact John so that we are made aware of them. **There is a high likelihood that items within the right of way, including irrigation and landscaping will be damaged or otherwise affected by construction activities. Repairs to these items are the responsibility of the property owner.**
